- 2. Directions (1 Corinthians 11:23-25)
- A. Through what the Saviour did (v.23, 25a)
 - Held up bread (v.23)
 - Held up the cup (v.25a)
- B. Through what the Saviour said (v.24, 25b)
 - Concerning the bread (v.24)
 - Concerning the cup (v.25a)



3. Desires (1 Corinthians 11:26, 28)

- A. Backward look to the cross (v.26a)
- B. Inward look to the conscience (v.28)
- C. Forward look to the crown (v.26b)



4. Disciplines (1 Corinthians 11:27-32)

- A. Judgment (vv.27-29)
- B. Sickness (v.30a)
- C. Death (v.30b)
